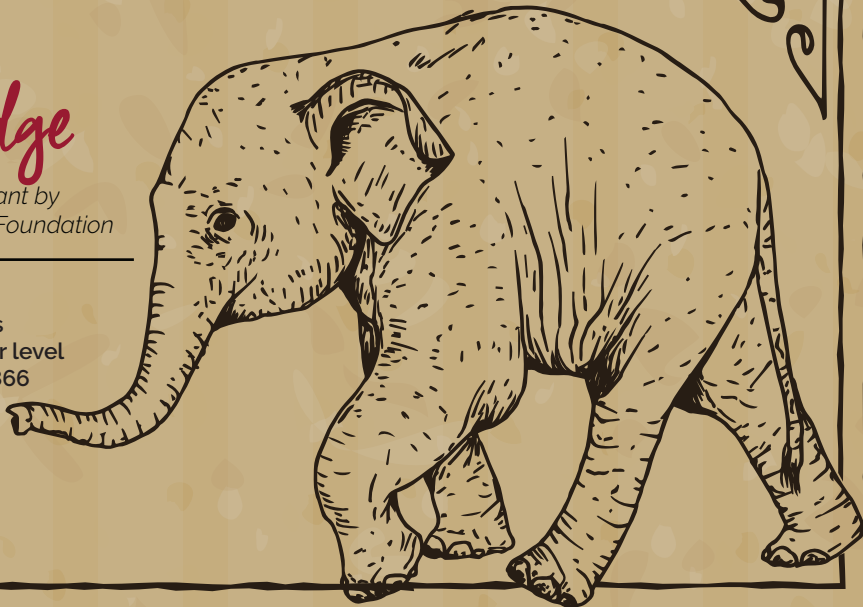

ABOUT THE PRESENTER

Sangdean Lek Chailert was born in 1961 in Baan Lao, a small village in Thailand. During her childhood, she had many opportunities to spend her time among the animals. Her grandfather, a tradition healer, allowed her to be part of his work, occasionally letting her help in the healing of the animals. It was at that time that she discovered that all animals strive to live and she became determined to save them.

Lek soon began advocating for the rights and welfare of the Asian elephant in Thailand. Advocating for positive change in the ways domestic and wild Asian elephants are treated has not been an easy battle.

Lek's mission continues to affect others as her voice is heard throughout the world and her mission to save the Asian elephants continues to expand. She has formed Save Elephant Foundation and has a dedicated team that works tirelessly by her side to protect the Asian elephant.
