Leatherby Libraries owns thousands of eBooks. This guide highlights the many collections available through Leatherby Libraries.

How to Access Leatherby Libraries' eBook Collections

To access our eBook collections:

- Begin at the Library's homepage (<http://www.chapman.edu/library>)
- Go to "Databases (search for articles)" near the bottom of the page and choose "Title" from the "Search Database by ..." drop-down menu
- At the Electronic Resources page, under "Add Resource Type" on the left side of the screen (below "Refine Your Search"), click the link for "eBook Collections"; or, you may simply scroll down the alphabetical list to locate a particular eBook collection
- Click "connect" once you locate the collection you wish to use

The following are brief descriptions for each collection.

AccessMedicine - McGraw-Hill

AccessMedicine provides access to over 60 medical titles, case files, diagnostic tools, videos, audio files, images, and illustrations.

Blackwell Reference Online - Wiley-Blackwell

Blackwell Reference Online consists of reference volumes in Social Sciences and Humanities subject areas such as Art, Business and Management, Communication and Media Studies, Cultural Studies, Economics, History, Literature, Medicine, Psychology, and Sociology.

Colloquium Digital Library of Life Sciences - Morgan & Claypool Publishers

Colloquium Digital Library of Life Sciences is organized into several series including Integrated Systems Physiology, Developmental Biology, Cell Biology of Medicine, and Biotechnology.

eBooks on EBSCOhost (formerly NetLibrary) – EBSCO Industries

EBSCOhost's eBook Collection provides access to full text eBooks on multiple subjects. At the search screen, enter terms in the search boxes to locate books on your topic. At the results page, you may choose to read books online or check out books.



- Click the **eBook Full Text** link to read the book in the EBSCOhost's eBook Viewer tool.
- Click the **Download (Offline)** link to check out the book and read it on your computer using Adobe Digital Editions (with a "My EBSCOhost" account).

Once you enter the full text of an EBSCOhost eBook online, you may click on the arrows near the bottom of the screen to navigate through the book or click on the content links (left side of the screen) to be directed to specific sections or chapters. You can also search for terms within the full text of an eBook. To download eBooks to read offline, you must first create a free My EBSCOhost account. Emerald eBooks - Emerald Publishing

This multidisciplinary eBook collection provides access to the "Emerald Business, Management, and Economics eBook Series Backlist Library Collection" and the "Emerald Social Sciences eBook Series Backlist Library Collection". Subjects covered include Accounting & Finance, Business Ethics & Law, Education, Health Care Management/Healthcare, Human Resource Management, Marketing, Organization Studies, and Sociology & Public Policy. Select "Books" from the "All content" drop-down menu on the left side of the search page, and enter terms in the search box above to locate books on your topic.

Gale Virtual Reference Library - Gale Cengage

Gale Virtual Reference Library consists of a collection of reference sources covering Arts, Biography, Business, Education, Medicine, and Social Science. You may conduct keyword searches throughout the entire collection or within a specific publication.

IEEE-Wiley eBooks Library - IEEE

You may view this Engineering-related eBook collection to find titles by browsing an alphabetical listing, entering keywords or a unique phrase, or glancing through subjects to locate specific titles. When available, individual eBook homepages provide links to chapters in PDF format.

Oxford Scholarship Online - Oxford University Press

Oxford Scholarship Online provides access to select full text eBooks in the areas of Mathematics, Music, Philosophy, Physics, Political Science, Psychology, and Social Work.

SAGE Reference Online - SAGE Publications

You may access SAGE's full text encyclopedias and handbooks online in areas such as Business & Management, Communication & Media Studies, Counseling & Psychotherapy, Criminology & Criminal Justice, Education, Health & Social Welfare, Politics & International Relations, Psychology, and Sociology.

Springer eBooks - Springer Publishing

This eBook platform provides select access to Springer eBooks in Behavioral Science and Business & Economics for the years 2005 - 2010 and Earth & Environmental Science for the years 2009 - 2010. Each title offers full text search capability. Individual chapters can be downloaded.

Synthesis Digital Library of Engineering and Computer Science - Morgan & Claypool Publishers

This collection comprises eBooks authored by experts in the fields of Engineering and Computer Science. Each "Lecture" contains information on an important research or development topic. Content is available in PDF format with live links to references.
